A TALE FROM THE TRAIL

By: Pat Roberts On Thursday, 8 October 2015, Ellen Ott, Mike Hermes and I headed east on I-10 at "0-dark thirty". We reached New Orleans later that day for a spate of gambling.

The next morning Ellen and I signed in at the French Quarter Police Station to register for the French Quarter Walk. The weather was beautiful, a great day for walking. As we meandered the historic streets of the French Quarter, I was wishing I had remembered to bring my walking stick. It had been about 40 years since my last visit to New Orleans. A lot had changed but a lot had not. The St. Louis Cathedral and the Square had not changed much. Always an enjoyable area. Stopped for a bit of shopping and refreshment at the French Quarter Market. Being "good girls", we did not go to Cafe du Monde for beignets. (My arm could have been twisted so easily!)

Later that morning we headed east again, this time on I-90 to Biloxi, MS. After checking in to our hotel, Ellen and I drove across the Biloxi Bay Bridge to the Waffle House to register for the three Ocean Springs walks. We went first to the Gulf Islands National Seashore. This is a beautiful national park which should be tooting its horn! Beautiful trails, quiet and serene. It was Columbus Day Weekend and the park's camp grounds were full but everything was clean and peaceful. The Visitors' Center was rebuilt after Hurricane Katrina and was beautifully done. All this and there was no admission charge!

Next we attempted to do the Downtown Ocean Springs walk but everywhere we drove thru the city we found streets blocked off and nowhere to park. Giving up for the time being on this one, we returned to the hotel. As we were driving through Ocean Springs and Biloxi we kept seeing beautiful classic cars. Unbeknownst to us, we had arrived on the weekend of the annual Gulf Coast Cruisers All along the main drag the cars were driving up and down continuously. People sat in their lawn chairs with their coolers, some set up tailgate parties and all watched the cars. We heard that there were over 6,000 cars registered.

Ellen and I walked over to the Biloxi Visitors Center and weaving our way through craft booths set up on the grounds and in the Visitor Center, registered for the Downtown Biloxi walk. We ended up modifying the walk to dodge traffic and take advantage of the car show by staying on the Beach Blvd, walking both sides of the street. That night we were treated to a Beach Boys concert in the hotel. Mike had snagged us second row, center, seats!

Sunday morning Ellen and I drove back to Ocean Springs. We did the Biloxi Bay Bridge walk first. There is a beautiful tile mural on the Ocean Springs side. Then we found a place to park and did the Downtown Ocean Springs walk. Ocean Springs is a beautiful little city with a lot of history and charm. Much rebuilding after Hurricane Katrina has taken place but there are areas that have not yet been rebuilt. The Ruskin Oak, an ancient oak tree, is one of the highlights of the walk.
