While the ranch is only 101 acres it is extremely unique regarding bio diversity. The Lazy U is located

between two other property owners that offer additional 100 acre plus land buffers on each side. These land buffers are in a natural state allowing for continued animal migration. The land tract is a product from the old land grant days being long and narrow that was typical of land grant property in the 1800's to allow for water frontage for irrigation and farming purposes. The Lazy U Ranch offers 1/4 mile of Guadalupe river frontage on the CONSTANT level Lake Placid. With today's extreme drought ongoing water is paramount to maintaining a robust ecological system.

The ranch offers 4 stock ponds with sizes ranging from 1/4 acre to 1 acre. All decisions for land management have been made with regards to improving animal habitat. While a small a herd of Longhorns are maintained for personal consumption and income even they play a part with land stewardship in mind by keeping weeds to minimum. Hunting is limited to that which is necessary to control game populations and in very short time frame during the photographic off-season.



An important component in the continuing land stewardship program is the utilization of Bee Hives to promote healthy plant pollination. Utilizing the expertise of Mark Gretchen/Gretchen Bee Ranch

(www.gretchenbeeranch.com), the Gretchen Bee Ranch maintains a healthy hive system on the ranch insuring one of the most important components in the ecological system. Prudent management practices of native grasses and continual landscaping for improvement of native trees and cactus has lead to an extremely healthy and robust numbers of ALL types of wildlife during the worst drought in Texas history. 150 plus species of birds have been witnessed, photographed and/or documented.

### A Legacy of Service at Lazy **U** Ranch

By opening up their Seguin ranch to wounded warriors, the Russell family continues a long tradition of service and they're just getting started.

In 2010, Craig Russell's father visited his son's ranch in Seguin and pointed to an old black and white photograph of a young girl on a horse that had been hanging on the family's wall seemingly forever. "He asked if I knew where it was from," recalls Russell, who conceded that he only knew it was a photo of his mother, Patty Sue McDonald, who at 7 years old was a trick rider.

Russell pulled the old photo down from the wall and could see there were silhouettes of soldiers behind her. "He said, 'That is your mom entertaining the wounded warriors at Fort Sam Houston in 1944," says Russell. "I got chills."

That same year, Russell, a veteran of the U.S. Navy, had started bringing men and women from the Warrior Transition Battalion at Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC) out to the family's ranch for daylong stints of rest and rehabilitation. Set beside the Guadalupe River, the Lazy U Ranch—named after the Texas cattle brand registered by Henry Ulbrich in 1914—provides the sort of activities injured service members need. "The Warrior Transition Battalion and BAMC saw a long time ago that the No. 1 healing tool was outdoor activity, like kayaking and fishing," says Russell.

In 2015 and 2016, the ranch was among the top places in the U.S. to host active duty rest and recuperation retreats. Groups of as few as 10 to as many as 400 come out to the ranch, where they are greeted by local volunteers who provide meals for the day with donations from churches and local companies like Bill Miller. Russell enforces one rule at the ranch: no cell phones. Why? The opportunity to engage with nature and fellow wounded warriors in a way that yields healing benefits is squandered when visitors are staring at screens. "I require that people enjoy each other's company *old school*," says Russell. "Social media has created such dysfunction about how to socialize as humans. This one-day event can help change that."



Beyond the fate seemingly at work in Russell continuing his mother's youthful service to wounded warriors, opening up his ranch to those who have served the country was only a part of his mission. For years, the crew of the submarine Russell had served on at the height of the Cold War gathered at the ranch on July Fourth for a reunion. The gathering that started in 2010 has since grown into a multiday celebration of service and patriotism that attracts hundreds of people who want to pay their respects to the military. At the 2012 gathering, Russell's crew honored their former boat chief, David Follo, who was dying of cancer, in an emotional ceremony that included a speech from Follo's first commanding officer, then 91.

"After that event, my life has been changed," says Russell. He and many of his guests at that event were motivated to do even more to honor those who have served in the military. Over the next two years they donated over \$110,000 for Russell to rehabilitate an old building on his property to provide wounded warriors respite from the heat and to create the SS American Memorial, which was dedicated in 2014. It houses paintings, plaques, statues and other artifacts and is equal parts history lesson and homage to sacrifice and service.

The memorial has become an important part of the experience for wounded warriors when they visit Russell's ranch. They make their way through the memorial and watch a video that provides history and a 'thank you' to veterans. "This gives a powerful visual history lesson on the Cold War and the

founding of our country," says Russell. "And it closes with a tribute to the sacrifice of our warriors."

If anything, Russell and his family are just getting started. In 2016, they formed the SS American Memorial Foundation with the intent of transforming the ranch into a campus devoted to service members and veterans, with a park, a church, facilities for those suffering from PTSD, and a veteran hospice and retirement community. In his work helping individual veterans, Russell has found that there is often a lack of communication between organizations that do good work. His vision is to provide a central command of sorts to coordinate assistance and make a bigger

## David Bonewitz, Ph.D.— AVA National President PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE


At our Albany Biennial Convention, during my "State of the AVA Nation" presentation, I issued a challenge to our clubs. While there will be some further refining to this challenge, here are the core elements:

### FOR THE NEXT 2 YEARS, EACH YEAR:

- Hold one more Traditional Event than the last year with target of at least 25 paid participants
- Recruit 8-10 new club members who walk as paid walkers an average of 10 events

- Recruit/convert 3 new/existing club members to become AVA Associate Members
- Plan for the future. If you are a club officer recruit, train, and groom someone to do your job! In other words, develop a succession plan.

These elements are the core to developing more capacity at the club level, and that is what we will be focusing on for the next 2 years. The challenge isn't easy whether your club hasn't done a Traditional Event in years or if it already does a number of Traditional Events. Likewise, recruiting new members means a club must have an outreach plan. The work being done by the Public Relations firm working for AVA should help here. Getting new or old members to become AVA Associate Members means that a club will need to make it clear to folks that there is a difference between being a "club member" and being an Associate Member of AVA. Finally, succession planning at the club level is essential if a club is going to survive for the future. There will be special recognition at the 2021 Convention for those clubs who accomplish the President's Challenge.
