IML/IWA Walking Events with Regina Overholt

I'm planning to go to Europe this spring to walk the Swiss, Belgian and English IML/IWA (International Marching League/International Walking Association) events. If anyone would like to come with me, I would enjoy the company. I have done all three of these events several times and "know the ropes," but I am not travel agent. The trip I envision will emphasize walking/volksmarching, but will allow a little time for sightseeing. To get IML/IWA credit, one needs to walk at least 20K

each (of the two) days of walks. All are IVV and offer shorter trails.

Tentative itinerary:

<u>27 Apr</u> (Thur) - fly to Europe (arriving morning of the 28th).

<u>29 - 30 Apr</u> - IML event in Bern/Belp, Switzerland (I have not done this for several years but, while in sight of some very impressive mountains, there were only a couple of hills each day.)

<u>1 May</u> - go to Belgium (method to be determined).

2-4 May - walk Belgian IVV walks (Belgium actually has regular day events almost every day, at least this time of the year.) Possibility of Dutch event. Some sightseeing.

5 May - sightsee in Brugg.

<u>6 - 7 May</u> - IML event Blankenberge, Belgium (Belgian beach resort highest hills are sand dunes separating the beach from inland, which is completely flat.)

8 May - go to England
9-12 May - walk British permanent
(YRE) trails. (There are permanent
trails almost anywhere in England that
you would want to sightsee. I have
done most of the major ones (although
not all of the ones in London), and am
willing to do most again. I am willing
to negotiate which ones to do. To
see where the permanent trails are,
check out the British Walking
Association's webpage at

13 - 14 May IML event in

Wellingborough, Northampton,
England (rolling countryside).

15 May - fly home

I am willing to have someone join me for only part of the time if they do not have enough vacation time.

Accommodations - I am thrifty (cheap) so I do not plan to stay in fancy accommodations. I have been known to stay in youth hostels (which are nicer in Europe than here in the US), but I can step up if it is an issue. I would probably stay in a "gasthaus" near Berne. Blankenberge is run by the local tourist board and they can book you into whatever style accommodations you want or are willing to pay for. Wellingborough will probably be in a motel. I will rent cars to get around (except in Blankenberge, where it is not needed and which only has pay parking; and London, if we go there, which has

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good public transportation). I am willing to do all the driving. Please let me know if you are interested in coming with me. E-mail me at regina_overholt@hotmail.com.

Members may also prepare special stamps for these events.

NEWS FROM CANADA

Planning for 2006 and beyond is now complete, with over 515 scheduled events and 265 Year Round or Seasonal events already planned. A few more of each are expected as the year unfolds, so be sure to check our web site at http://www.walks.ca for additions and updates. Next year, we continue to offer a variety of walk types from Volksmarches, Guided Walks, Map Walks, More Days Walks, a Round and Long Distance Walk and Multi-Day Walks in various locations throughout the country. We also welcome back an old member club in Kimberley, BC and a new Affiliate Member, Tater Tours, of Henderson, Nevada, USA.

This year, the Canadian Volkssport Federation is launching a number of walks grouped by themes in order to encourage more participation and appeal to individual walkers' personal interests; there's also a challenge to them. We have designated a number of new and existing YRE or Seasonal Walks as 'Capital Cities Walks' and others as 'Lighthouse Walks'. All are described in the coming issue of Volkssport Canada and Footpaths / Sentiers 2006, our publication for all walks in Canada for the year. There will also be a description of these walking programs on our web site early in the New Year. Two other similar programs are the 'Winter Walking Program' and the 'Group Walks' of existing YRE and Seasonal Walks, as announced in Volkssport Canada and Footpaths / Sentiers 2006. It is expected that other such walking themes will be developed over the year for implementation in 2007.

Our Annual General Meeting and Convention will be held on May 12 -14 in Edmonton, Alberta. The theme will be "Gateway to Wellness". A complete program description and registration forms are available at the Volkssport Association of Alberta web site at the following address: http://www.albertavolkssport.ca/CalE vents.asp . For those interested in our 'Capital Cities' and 'Canada Cup of Walking' programs, there is a possibility of two extra tours from Edmonton to Whitehorse, Yukon and Yellowknife, Northwest Territories. Please refer to the convention web site for more details. What better way to see and explore Canada's real north and obtain Volkssport credits for doing it!

A very important member of our CVF Executive, our Awards Coordinator, Anna McAnally, will be retiring from her position at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Edmonton in May, 2006. Non-Canadian walkers who have purchased IVV record books, and done their first walk in the books in Canada according to IVV rules, may send their books to Anna up to and including April 30, 2006. AFTER May 13, 2006, they should send their IVV record books to our new Awards Coordinator: Lea Tocher, 450 Rouge Rd., Winnipeg, MB Canada R3K 1K4.

An application to hold the CVF Annual General Meeting and Convention for 2007 in Victoria, BC has already been approved by the Board of Directors and planning is well under way. Information for the 2007 AGM should be available in mid-2006 at both the CVF and Volkssport Association of BC web sites. There is already serious interest for the AGM in 2008 to be held on our Atlantic Coast and a proposal is now being developed.
