Remember that AVA has brochures, business cards and other items they can send you to help promote Volkssporting any time your club hosts a booth at a local health fair or other promotional event.

The 2008-2009 Walk-Together Patch

We have selected the Walk-Together patch for 2008-2009. It will be available for events starting in September, 2008. The patch design came from 12 year old Callie Dunn, of troop 2637 in Centreville, Virginia, part of Girl Scouts of Our Nations Capitol. Bob Wright of the Loudoun Walking and Volkssport Club arranged with the council to hold the patch contest.



If your club has held Walk-Togethers with Girl Scouts and would like to work with the Girl Scout council in your area to design the patch for the 2009-2010 school year, please contact me, Nancy Wittenberg, at avayouth@ava.org. It would be great if a club in the west or south would volunteer. We have guidelines and forms which you can use. Because it is an award, those who want the patch must walk for credit. The patch can be used as the award for everyone for your walk if you wish, not just Girl Scouts. It can be ordered from AVA on consignment so you're not burdened with paying for patches you can't use. Please be conservative when you order patches. The AVA sends the patches with a Girl Scout Patches Consignment form. You return the form with the count of patches sold, and the unused patches along with the stamp for your walk. You can get patches on consignment for a scheduled group walk of a year round or seasonal as well. The AVA will bill the club for patches used. The cost for patches you use is \$1 each. Call the AVA office or email them to order patches and let them know what walk you want them for. If you want to have patches on hand for year rounds or seasonals, you may purchase the patches ahead of time. Purchased patches may not be returned.

Please remember that unless you are working with a local troop directly, Girl Scout councils need a great deal of lead time to publish events. It is now summer and most troops are not active until the fall. It would be a good time now, to contact your local council about walks you might be planning for winter or spring. Check out the AVA's website under Special Programs/Youth Programs to see more

information about Walk-Togethers. It includes a downloadable .PDF format copy of a Walk-Together brochure which is explains the process of arranging for walks for Girl Scouts. We'll be updating it with the new patch design shortly.

The sanctioning window is currently open and will remain so until the end of August. This is the only time of the year that you can sanction a Year Round Event. Seasonal Events entered during this time will appear in Starting Point as well.

Staff News

I am happy to now inform you that all regular staff have completed cross training in events, membership, and awards. If any staff member is absent on leave or out with illness another staff member can help you. Please join us in congratulating Cathy Turman, Events Coordinator, on her college graduation this June.

We have been receiving many calls from customers soon after they placed their orders wanting to know when they will receive their order. As printed in the TAW and on the web site, we allow four weeks for shipping. The reason we allow this length of time is that all shipping is done by one person, Kevin. Kevin usually ships out every week, however; in case he has to take care of other duties such as invoicing, or is out due to illness, then the four weeks allowable gives him time to perform these duties and shipping.

We also have customers sending in orders wanting us to notify them by phone or fax that we got the order. Again, this is not possible with only one person, namely Kevin, doing the

invoicing, and shipping. If you have a specific date you need your merchandise by then it should be specified on the order. If the date you want your merchandise by is close to the date we receive your order then we will contact you to see if you want to pay for next day or second day air, again we can not repeatedly try to contact you, so please provide us a way to reach you during our operating hours of 8 to 5, Monday through Friday. Central Standard Time.

Only Clubs are allowed to have orders billed, all individuals must pre-pay for merchandise including shipping. The shipping chart is located on the web and in the TAW. Figure shipping on your total order then apply the discount then add Texas sales tax of 8.25%, if your shipping address is located in Texas. Some individual orders are being sent in without enough money included to pay the total. Those not including the correct payment will have to be held and eventually returned if we can not promptly get in touch with you.

SPECICAL EVENTS UPDATE

There are three Special Events Programs that will end on December 31, 2008. You have five months to get them all finished and get that much coveted award.

The great news is that there are 8 **new** programs beginning January 1, 2009. It appears there should be at least one special event program that would fit your special interest or walk favorites. You have five months to get your books and be ready to start your new programs by January 1, 2009.

2. "Museum Walk America"25 events that pass by a MuseumJanuary 1, 2009 through Dec. 31, 2011

- 3. "Veterans Memorial"
 30 events that pass a veteran statue/memorial/monument.
 January 1, 2009 through Dec. 31, 2012
- 4. "Walking Waterfalls"
 12 events that include the sighting of a natural waterfall.
 January 1, 2009 through Dec. 31, 2011
- 5. "America's Artistic Heritage" 25 events passing an active or historic community theatre, Opera house or fine arts museum. January 1, 2009 through Dec. 31, 2011
- 6. "Liberty Bell Rings"
 15 events that pass the bell displayed outside or the location where it is housed

July 4, 2009 through July 4, 2012

- 7. "Walking America's Fire Houses" 24 events passing a Fire House January 1, 2009 through Dec.31, 2011.
- 8. "Walking Historic Churches" 15 events passing Historic Churches at least 75 years old. January 1, 2009 though Dec. 31, 2009.

Of course, there are other Special Events Programs that are already in existence that won't end in 2008.

Courthouse). Proceed to 19th St (4th stop light). Turn right. Proceed half a block past the Steamboat House to the Education Center, on the right. From Houston: Take I-45 North to Exit 114. Continue on the feeder road, turn right [east] at 19th Street [Ward's Furniture is on the corner]. Continue about 8 blocks to Avenue O. The Education Center is on the right, about half a block up. From East: Hwy 30 to Sam Houston Ave on west side of Courthouse. Proceed as above [from Dallas]. From West: Hwy 30 past I-45. Proceed as above [from Dallas]. See ya on the trail!
